HEN I WAS A KID, 4-H and Pony Club spurred me to study hard to learn as much about horses as I could. Pony Club in particular has levels to which to aspire, requiring advanced book knowledge in addition to riding and management skills.

As a horse-crazy teen, the chance to absorb all things equine-and be rewarded for it!-was nirvana. Now there's a new opportunity for young horse people: The United States Hunter Jumper Association is offering the Horsemanship Quiz Challenge to reward equestrian knowledge. (Sure, your saddle may have a horn, but it's a great opportunity to learn.)

Participants must not have reached their 21st birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year, and must be a junior or amateur member of USHJA in good standing. You have to register for the Challenge, and complete Levels One and Two, no later than September 1. They're open-book quizzes; a national competition will feature top finishers competing in a hands-on challenge and a tougher closed-book exam. (For more info, go to ushja.org.)

A Case for Posting the Trot.

Regardless of a rider's weight or technique, the peak forces exerted on a horse's back are greater when she sits the trot than when she posts to the gait, according to a new study from the Netherlands. Researchers at Wageningen University collected kinematic data as 13 different riders both sat and posted to the trot on the same horse. They then calculated the load placed on the horse's back as he trotted at a steady pace. The analysis showed that the average force is comparable in both a sitting and posting trot. The two force peaks that occur during each stride cycle were consistent, regardless of a rider's weight or style of riding. But the peak forces were significantly lower when the riders were posting compared to when the riders sat at the trot. The researchers conclude that this study "supports the general assumption that posting to the trot is less demanding for the horse that sitting the trot"
