Member Spotlight By Lynda Fosnot







bu Did You Know?



Which of Ten Types Is Your Horse?

1. The Hard Keeper - You probably found him on Craigslist for free or close to it. He has eaten his former owners out of house and home, not to mention their retirement fund. And yet, he still looks anorexic. No amount of vet visits, beet pulp, weight builders or free choice hay has worked. You bought him because you felt sorry for the skin and bones horse that the owners told you they had just rescued.

2. Mr. Tender Toes - This horse looks at a rock and bingo! he's lame... especially if it's a beautiful day for riding and he spies your saddle. If you have to go to work, or the weather is miser-

able, he's magically sound.

3. The Easy Keeper - This horse stays fat on air.

4. The Alpha Mare - Like her label, Alpha, she has to be first...first in, first out, first fed. This horse is in control,

of other horses, and of you.

5. The Scaredy Cat - This horse will spook at a butterfly, and knows there are monsters around every corner. Never approach him from the rear. Build a stash of plastic bags to work on the 'desensitizing' program.

6. Mr. Accident Prone - If there is one nail in 10 miles of board fencing, he will find it. You are personally paying for the vet's home. And if you try bubble wrapping the stall, plan to pay for colic surgery after he's eaten the bubble wrap.

7. The Experienced Rider - This horse is multi-talented at multi-tasking. Buck, bolt, rear, kick and bite - he can do it all in a five-second time frame. Every time you ride him without getting thrown, you feel a sense of gratitude towards him, and are convinced he's just misunderstood.

8. The Escape Artist - This horse will help you meet your neighbors; however, also be prepared to meet animal control and maybe even the police. You could become famous when he makes the 6:00 news for running down the

highway during rush hour.

9. The Stable Vice Master - Cribbing, weaving, pacing...there is an upside to these habits. The horse will stay in shape from constant movement, this will break down the manure so you won't have to clean his stall as often. and the cribbing will mean no teeth floating expenses. He's a self-floater.

10. The Bombproof Babysitter - This is the horse that makes the feed bills and the muck raking all worth it. Good luck in finding him!.

Four Reasons Your Horse Says "No"

You ask your horse to do something and he says, "Nope, ain't doing that. Is he being stupid, difficult, stubborn? No, his reaction is based on four issues: Fear, Disrespect, Misunder-

standing, or Pain.

Fear: You've heard it a thousand times. Horses are prey animals. It makes little difference to the horse if he's in the wilds of Wyoming or a riding arena in Pennsylvania. Self preservation is his mantra. Everything horses do for humans occurs only after they know they are safe. If the horse perceives danger in the rider's request (crossing a stream, for example), he must completely trust his rider that his well be-

ing will not be jeopardized.

Disrespect: Perhaps the horse hasn't accepted you as his leader, the head of your little herd of two. Becoming the leader is most effectively established on the ground. That's how horses interact with each other, establish their hierarchy, on the ground. The famed Spanish Riding School, established in 1572, requires their students to work with their horses on the ground for four years of the eight-year training program, before they are allowed to begin their riding. Like the Alpha mare, you must prove yourself. Even after you've earned the respect, it's a horse's nature to continually test you, to be sure you're still worthy of being the leader. Misunderstanding: Horses don't speak English, and 'force' is not a language. They respond to clear communication in a form they understand. If the horse responds differently to your request or cue, first figure out if your method of requesting was misunderstood, unclear to your horse. For example, do you need to be lighter, firmer, release pressure faster etc.?

Pain: Though horses are stalwart, and programmed to hide their pain as a survival instinct (the herd's sickest, weakest animal is the target of the predator), a rider's request that increases a horse's physical pain, threatens its self preservation. Whether or not the horse accepts you as the leader, resistance will occur when pain is involved. Learn your horse's symptoms of discomfort. Before riding, check for sore areas - the back, legs, and teeth, the most common area of potential pain is in the mouth.

When your horse says no, there's a reason; and it's your job as the leader to figure out what that reason is.
