

An Interview with Arabian Horse Times



1. Where did you come from? How has that impacted your involvement with the Arabian horse?

My love for horses started on my Aunts farm in Indiana when I was around 5 years old. Her son let me ride his pinto and I found my passion. Of course I constantly begged my parents for a horse, they couldn't afford it back then. To satisfy my horse craving I would use my baby sitting money and rent horses at the local livery and go trail riding. When I started working, I saved my money and in 1967 bought my first horse, a Saddlebred gelding and my second horse in 1970, a Quarter Horse gelding/ Then in 1973 I traded my Quarter Horse to Wayne Pavel of Shiloh Arabian Farms for a 3 yr. old Ferzon bred Stallion and that started my love affair with the Arabian Breed. In the late 1970's I met Pearl Draves of Ivanhoe Arabians. She had a huge influence on my knowledge & appreciation of Arabians and we became best of friends. I moved my horses to her farm and for the next 20 years, we showed our Arabians together. I now have my horses with Randy Sullivan & continue to show in the Western division; a passion that has endured for 42 years.

- 2. What makes a good western trainer? A good western horse? I believe a western trainer is no different than any other trainer. They should have patience, consistency, be rewarding & have the ability to judge an individual horse's learning capacity. A good western horse is quite, soft gaited, willing, happy to do his job, & have the confirmation to carry itself with ease.
- 3. When looking at a western prospect, what are you looking for in the horse's structure?

 I like a western horse to have a short back, strong hip, good lay of shoulder, good legs & feet, soft free movement & of course it sure doesn't hurt to have a pretty face.
- 4. What is your biggest pet peeve you see in the western division today? Horses that are behind the vertical or don't perform their gaits with soft free forward movement.
- 5. More than ever, the Arabian breed is turning toward breeding for specific divisions. In Western horse breeding, what kind of look is being bred? (Discuss in terms of strength of structure, trainability, quality, movement, and overall look.) Today's western horses are absolutely more beautiful than ever. Their overall athletic look is breathtaking to watch. I do feel there is room to improve on movement by allowing their shoulders to free up and to have an all over more relaxed look.
- 6. What are some of the positives you're seeing today in the Western division? (in training, breeding, or showing.) I felt the 2014 US Nationals was the best Nationals for the Western Performance Division I have seen in a long time. Most horses where soft, more relaxed and moving forward. I hope this trend stays with us.

Reporter on the Scene by Gail Wiot



On Sept. 29th there will be a march in Washington, DC in support of the Safe Food, Safe Horse Act. House Bill #HR1942 & Senate Bill #1214. I will be attending with about 300 supporters.

US horses have been in danger of slaughter for some time now, No breed has escaped this fate. As a result the number of Arabians being sent to auction and ultimately showing up in Kill Pens should be absolutely alarming to Arabian Horse owners and lovers. This is not to say that other horses have no value.

I have been involved protesting Horse slaughter for some time. I worked side by side with a number of Horse people and Legislators to close the Horse slaughter plant in DeKalb, Illinois. The plant when closed left serious damage to the environment as well as many unpaid violations


85% of all Americans do not support Horse slaughter. US horses are not bred as a food source which should bring major concern to anyone consuming this meat. It has been documented by the European Union that contaminated meat was found in horses exported from the US. Therefore, regulations have been put in place to stop the export of US horses.

There are Arabian Horse rescues and other Arabian Horse owners involved in locating Arabians at auctions and Kill Pens. You may have seen information on the website if not go to Arabian Kill Pen and Auction Horses. There you see a number of horses and those trying to save and re-home them. Slaughter is never a fitting end to a horses life.

As a result of the outcry surrounding contaminated meat and Horse slaughter, there is now a bill pending in Congress called the Safe Food, Safe Horse Act. Everyone is invited to attend.









